

PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT FOR EXAMINERS

As an AMEB (NSW) examiner, you are required to complete professional development in every year that you examine. It is also a requirement that you submit a list of these professional development activities to the AMEB (NSW) office.

What is professional development?

Professional Development for AMEB (NSW) examiners must include current evidence of a variety of activities undertaken to develop and maintain examining skills. Examples may include:

- Annual participation in, and/or preparation and presentation of courses;
- Any relevant scholarly and/or research activity;
- Participation in and/or attendance at conferences, workshops and masterclasses (Please include only 3 to 4 hours of the *most relevant* activity, excluding concerts).

In addition, examiners may include

- Adjudicating (limit up to three);
- Performance at concerts, recitals, master classes etc (limit up to three);
- Attendance at concerts/theatre productions (relating to your examiner status) may form *part* of the annual professional development requirements (limit up to five of the *most relevant*).

Examiners are requested to write a short paragraph about what has been gained from the various professional development activities undertaken during the year.
